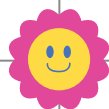
Sing the Song "Little Bird, Little Bird" (Words on back)

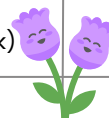

29

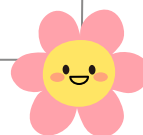
Pretend to dig, plant, and water an imaginary garden

- Encourage drawing and storytelling by providing your child with paper and crayons to draw pictures, then ask them to tell you about their drawing. Write down their words and read them back together to enhance narrative skills and demonstrates the connection between spoken and written language.
- Talk about print in everyday life. Point out words on signs, packages, and menus to build early reading and vocabulary skills.

(Tune: "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star")

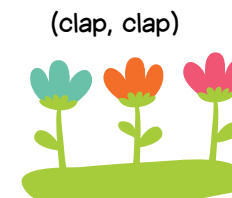
Little bird, little bird, in the tree,
